In the Female ward, there were 20 patients, among whom five were post operative .The clinical conditions of these 20 patients included Thyromegaly, Cholelithiasis, Carcinoma breast, Incisional hernia, Umbilical hernia, Hydatid cyst of spleen, fistula in ano, ischio rectal abscess, proctocolitis. pilonidal sinus, Haemorrhoids, and associated ano rectal conditions with Fissure-in ano etc, which required admission and further investigations. You would observe from the listed cases operated on the day of the inspection, by the department of Surgery, we had 4 major surgeries: Mastectomy, Laproscopic cholecystectomy and hernioplasties and, 3 minor surgeries i.e fissure - in ano, breast abscess and a wound that required secondary suturing.

In female wards patients were genuine and different diagnosis patients were there. On cross verification done with the patients and with case papers few case sheet attached. Deficiency rectified.

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Summary of assessment: Dean comments for the deficiencies pointed out by the assessors:

- 1)Surgery wards: The 08 history sheets of patients admitted into the surgical wards could not be written up as these patients were directly admitted into the wards from the OPD. The SR and IRs had gone to sign the attendance sheet in the presence of the MCI assessor at the Medical College in the morning and, were not able to write it up before the commencement of ward visit by the respective MCI inspectors. In the OB – GYN section we have 100-120 deliveries /month with over 20 obstetric patients admitted. Few Gynaec cases come from afar areas and also referred from our PHCs and RHC are admitted for evaluation until proved to have no pathology. We have Gyneac post operative cases two in the ward and two were in the surgical ICU which are to be included.
- 2) We have overall 20 beds in ER distributed as follows: 15, in ER (main room) three, in labour room (adjacent room of ER); and two, in the triage room of the ER. Hence it is not deficient in bed capacity.
- 3) We have a well -equipped centralized medical ICU of 15 beds, of which 5 are dedicated to the PICU. Additionally, we have a Nursery with 3 baby incubators and separate phototherapy machine, providing level 2 care for neonates. The MSR of MCI (Jan 2017 page 20) stipulates under Medical and Allied specialities ICU, ICCU and Paediatrics that an intensive care area should be available. This area is available with us. The patients in the 5 PICU beds are manned by Paediatricians. On the day of the inspection (16/3/2017) there was a paediatric patient with sickle cell anemia in crisis being managed by the Paediatricians. In all previous inspections this point about a separate PICU has never been raised. For surgical Patients we have a separate 5 bed ICU, and 10 beds as Post- operative recovery.
- 4) Overall we have a 15 ventilators in the institution their placement is distributed as follows ICU 2, ER -2, SICU 3 and OT 8. Additionally we have 42 multichannel monitors distributed to the ICU 15, Ward 10, ER 6, OP-6, SICU 5, Post, and Triage-1. We shift the needed equipment to the various areas as and when needed.
- 5) Deficiency in Residents: Equivalence of DNB to MD/MS: As per the Gazette notification 213/1st Oct 2012 Part III See 4 para III "Candidates who have undergone DNB training (broad specialties) other than in hospital mentioned in (II) above shall undergone additional year of senior residency in a MCI recognized institutions".
- a)Dr. K Praveen Kumar DNB in Anesthesia has been our Senior Resident since 15-12-2015.
- b) The IR's were cited as deficient, as their salary statement from bank is not available. We will obtain the statement . We enclose their pay slips signed by payroll for these 4 Ir Residents
