- One 6-storied building [Dr. B. C. Roy Institute of Basic Medical Sciences] having the departments of Anatomy, Physiology, Pharmacology and part of Biochemistry and Microbiology. Two new lecture theaters 6 & 7 have been set up on top floor.
- One 6-storied [Ronald Ross Building] having the departments of Medicine, Surgery, Gynecology & Obstetrics, Nuclear Medicine, part of Biochemistry and some superspeciality departments. Also housing the Central Library on 3rd and 6th floors.
- One 3-storied building [Casualty Block] having the departments of Pathology and part of Microbiology and Dentistry.
- One 2-storied building [Forensic Medicine Block] having the departments of Forensic Medicine and Mortuary.
- One 3-storied building [part of Institute of Psychiatry] having two older lecture theaters.

#### The hospital is located in a separate building. Yes - spread over multiple buildings as follows:

- The Main Building of the hospital contains the indoor wards of Medicine, Pediatrics and Surgery and Departments of Anesthesiology and Dermatology.
- · Cardiology has a separate building.
- · Gynecology & Obstetrics and Neonatology are housed in a separate 3-storied hospital building.
- Another hospital building houses the Eye and ENT departments on the first floor with the rest devoted to Cardiothoracic & Vascular Surgery.
- Orthopedics is situated in the basement of the Woodburn Block building.
- · Chest, Radiotherapy, Nephrology and Urology are in a separate block adjacent to Ronald Ross Building.
- · Rheumatology Building is located between Blood Bank and old OPD Building
- New School of Digestive and Liver Diseases building contains the Gastroenterology and Hepatology departments.
- · New School of Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation Building located adjacent to old building.



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
